Jan. 3, 2020

"What the Early History of Bethlehem Teaches Us about Race"

This opening session will offer a framework for understanding some of the ways race has shaped individual and communal life in the US, from the beginning until today. We will use the 18th century history of Moravians in Bethlehem and the early missions as a lens through which we can see the way our theology and good intentions can bring life and peace to others but also lead us astray.



Jan. 10, 2020

"The Church's Hidden Secret: Our (Tacit) Approval of White Supremacy"

The Rev. Dr. Riddick Weber. Associate Professor of Pastoral Ministry Moravian Theological Seminary

Since the arrival of the first Africans in the English colonies that became the United States, the church has struggled with issues of slavery and race. The session will offer a historical overview of the church's participation in the creation of the racist structures in American society, particularly in relationship to political and economic processes, and invite participants to consider how they can engage in dismantling them. Content for this session will draw heavily from Jemar Tisby's *The Color of Compromise*.
