### From Pastor Janel

#### Behind the scenes of the August 13<sup>th</sup> Experience. . . .

Over the course of this last year, our Moravian Women monthly fellowship groups read the Moravian Women study guide centered around the events of the Moravian Church Renewal, also known as the August 13<sup>th</sup> Experience. Perhaps the main theme of this study is how misleading the name “August 13<sup>th</sup> Experience” is in itself! There was certainly an experience on August 13, 1727, when residents of Herrnhut, which previously had extensive disagreements and theological disputes, came together in worship and said they “learned how to love”. They shared a feeling of the Holy Spirit bringing them together, and despite differences, were one “in Christ”.

But in the chapters that detailed the events leading up to August 13<sup>th</sup>, 1727, we learned how the experience did not occur in a vacuum, rather it was an intentional process of

community building and developing good policies for living together. In fact, it started in the winter of 1727 when Count Nicholas von Zinzendorf intentionally took a break from his court duties to spend time with each family in Herrnhut, learning more about them and creating small groups. This led Zinzendorf to work on the “Brotherly Agreement”, a document we still ask new members to sign as they join the church. <https://www.moravian.org/2018/06/moravian-covenant-for-christian-living/>. Now called the Moravian Covenant for Christian Living, instead of a faith statement, this covenant is a pledge to how we will live our lives as “witnesses” in our families, our communities and greater world. This first Moravian Covenant (Brotherly Agreement) was introduced to the community on July 4, 1727, and voluntarily signed by the residents of Herrnhut, many of whom had been previously in disagreement.

From those small but important series of steps to build trust and community came the August 13 experience of the Holy Spirit. As the Rev. Matthew Allen wrote in this Moravian Women’s study guide “Call to Prayer for Renewal”, “It is important to note that after the August 13<sup>th</sup> experience the community was never completely free from conflict. (People are still humans after all!). The difference is that after August 13<sup>th</sup>, 1727, the Moravians had sufficient momentum to handle their problems in stride. They were able to disagree without being disagreeable”.

What do we learn from that August 13<sup>th</sup> nearly 300 years ago? We will never erase conflicts or tensions, but without pushing ourselves beyond our comfort zones to get to know different people and share small but significant acts of kindness and community building, differences will seem insurmountable.

All different ages in Herrnhut were part of this spiritual renewal. This means that all of us are responsible for building community and being in the process of educating and reeducating ourselves - a good reminder that we all can go “back to school”! As we look at uncertain and frightening times around us and our world, what is our part in building community, bridging difference, working for justice so that the Holy Spirit, as it did in 1727, might blow through and inspire our communities to know and live God’s peace?

### Welcome Guest Preachers this August

We honor the prayer day for education, and especially remember our partners at Moravian University and Theological Seminary on Sunday, August 24<sup>th</sup> by inviting the Rev. Dr. Riddick Weber, associate dean of the Bethlehem campus of Moravian Theological Seminary, and associate professor of the practice of pastoral ministry, to preach.

The following week, we welcome back our former pastoral associate, the Rev. Maggie Wellert, to share a sermon with us on August 31<sup>st</sup>. This will be our last 10 a.m. summer worship service.

### Welcome Betsy Miller Part-Time Pastoral Assistant

The Rev. Dr. Betsy Miller, a retired Moravian pastor and member of Central Moravian Church, will start her service as a part-time Pastoral Associate for August 1, 2025 – May 2026. This interim 8-10 hr/week position will provide visitation and pastoral care assistance along with Pastor Janel. Betsy will also relate to our Social Action committees and teams (Mental Health, Care for Creation, and Racial Justice), and continue to lead the World Heritage committee. We are glad that she can also provide leadership occasionally in worship and sharing in preaching later this fall. Please continue to reach out to either Pastor Janel or Pastor Betsy with any pastoral care concerns, including hospitalizations. We remind our congregation that we no longer get notified for any hospitalizations and we would be happy to visit or place individuals on our prayer chain.

### What Else is Happening in Central's Staff?

At the time of this *Belfry's* publication, a small committee is interviewing potential candidates for a part-time director of Christian Education position, a permanent position intended to enhance our pastoral staff's ability to provide guidance and growth to our children and adult Christian Education and Church Family Life programs. The Joint Board, as noted elsewhere, will soon begin the process of a call for an associate pastor. In this time of transition, we are grateful not only to our paid staff and clergy leadership, but also the strength in our many lay leaders that provide the energy, skills and time for our ministries to thrive.

### World Heritage is Our Community's Heritage: Community Celebration of Moravian Church Settlements-Bethlehem World Heritage Inscription September 6<sup>th</sup>!

On Saturday, September 6<sup>th</sup>, 2025, (12 pm. – 7 p.m.) we will take time as a community to come together to celebrate the Moravian Church Settlement's new World Heritage Status. We understand that our strength is in our diverse Bethlehem community and our living heritage is best celebrated by our arts and music, community gatherings, and sharing in food and fun.

So come out for a block party on Church Street, Payrow Plaza at City Hall and all throughout the Central Church Green! The day begins on the lower church green with an opening ceremony at 12 p.m. followed by an unveiling of a new city mural and World Heritage inscription plaque. Starting at 1 p.m., booths will be open with family programs and free giveaways from community partners and the Bethlehem area Moravian Churches. Also, from 1 – 5 p.m., live music will be happening on both Payrow Plaza and the lower church green, the Moravian Museum and Central will offer free tours, and more! The Johnston Festival Memorial concert will be within Central's sanctuary at 3 p.m. A free ice cream social, sponsored by the Bethlehem Area Moravian churches, will be held from 5 – 7 p.m. on the church green. And if you are a Moravian sugarcake baker, or want to test out a recipe, consider submitting your sugarcake to be judged on Sept. 6<sup>th</sup> as well! The day will end with a Community Lovefeast outside on the church green at 5:30 p.m. led by the Bethlehem Area Moravian churches. Come celebrate the history and living presence of the Moravian Community and our greater Bethlehem Community on Saturday, September 6<sup>th</sup> with us!

It's beautiful to think of this practice as a metaphor for your life, to see the broken, difficult, or painful parts of you as radiating light, gold, and beauty. Kintsugi teaches you that your broken places make you stronger and better than ever before. When you think you are broken, you can pick up the pieces, put them back together, and learn to embrace the cracks. Registration is required and is limited.

### Cybersecurity

Cybersecurity is the way to protect computer networks and systems from service disruption, information theft and service redirection. The goal is simply to defend and protect servers, personal and private data, computers and mobile devices (smartphones, laptops and tablets) from attack resulting in damage or theft.

Cyber threats aren't just growing; they are evolving at a very rapid rate. In 2024, there were 3,205 data breaches reported effecting 353 million victims. Major companies lost billions of customer records. Cybersecurity is essential and cannot be ignored.

The Digital Ministry Committee is dedicated to keeping our congregation informed regarding the ever changing world of technology and will conduct a second annual workshop and update on Sunday, August 17<sup>th</sup> in the Christian Education building, Nitschmann Hall (40 W. Church Street, Bethlehem) after the 10 a.m. worship service.

### Join Us for Candle-Making

It is time to prepare for the 2025 Christmas Holiday Season with the making of **Beeswax Candles**. Production starts on Tuesday, September 2 and repeats on Tuesday the 9<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday the 16<sup>th</sup>. A 9:00 a.m. start with a break for coffee and donuts around 10:30 a.m. has been the norm. We are usually cleaned up and ready to go home around noon.



For those that may be interested in helping, two stations are traditionally established. There is wick preparation in one room and mold stringing (12 candles to a mold) in the "hot shop" where wax is also poured. The molds cool rather quickly, allowing the candles to be removed, hung to dry, and the molds reused several times throughout the morning. We will produce between 8 and 10 thousand candles that will be used for our Christmas Eve Service and seasonal activities of other churches, universities and civic groups.

The rooms used for candle making are in the basement of the Central Moravian Church main office at 73 W. Church Street. Parking is available in the parking lot at the rear of the building.

### Reduce, Reuse, Recycle & Use Less Plastic

- Donate extra produce (fruit, vegetables, herbs) to Central's Food Pantry. Please call the Church Office to connect with a Food Pantry volunteer; he/she will let you know which days food should be brought in.
- Use paper towels made from bamboo, instead of regular paper towels. While they cost a bit more, they can be washed and reused many times.
- Take showers instead of baths. A shower of 7 minutes or less under a 2-gallon/minute low-flow showerhead is more water and energy efficient than taking a bath in a tubful of water.
- And leave your shower fan on about 10 minutes after you shower. This reduces humidity and makes your bathroom less hospitable to mildew and mold.
- Save old toothbrushes for scrubbing dirt and stains out of hard-to-reach places.
- Make sure that heating/cooling vents are unobstructed.
