From Pastor Janel

The month of April begins for us with the celebration of Easter. And, as hard as it can be for those who know how the story ends, imagine walking with Mary Magdalene and the other Mary back to the tomb where they laid Jesus, your friend and leader, just a few days before, and finding an empty tomb and a message of hope; Jesus lives! Emotions abound, and the translations of Matthew 28:8 show these women feeling this way; “afraid yet filled with joy” (NIV), “with fear and great joy” (NRSV), and “deep in wonder and full of joy” (The Message). New beginnings, especially ones where the path isn’t scripted and the future unknown, are times of great joy but also times with a bit of fear and wonder built into the uncertainty that surrounds them. Owning these feelings, Mary Magdalene and the other Martha set off on the first step of a life-changing path to proclaim the nothing will defeat the love of God, not even death on a cross.

We hope you will worship with us on Easter. First, for Easter Dawn as we act out that place of darkness, grief and fear from a pre-dawn Sanctuary worship at 6:15 a.m., to a walk into the sunrise at God’s Acre, as the Trombone Choir joyfully proclaims the Lord is Risen. And then at Easter worship at 9 a.m.(Chapel) or 11 a.m. (Sanctuary) and of course in between those services at 10 a.m. for the joyous chaos of the Easter Egg hunt and Easter Workshop.

I also hope you will join us for the “deep wonder and fullness of joy” that will come in worship in the following weeks. We are excited to celebrate baptisms on April 12th and April 19th and confirmations on April 26th. These special moments bring children (sacrament of baptism) and youth (rite of confirmation) into a deeper relationship with God and their church community, as their parents and they themselves, through confirmation, continue to walk in a new path along their faith journey. We pray that they will do so with deep wonder and the fullness of joy!

Likewise, we gather to remember the care for God’s natural world, marking Earth Day and activities around Care for Creation on April 19th. We welcome the Rev. Dr. Heather Hartung to preach and a special intergenerational workshop at 10 a.m. (April 19) to remind us to grow in wonder and joy at the creation that surrounds us.

Gathering in joy is one of our main calls as a church community and we are thrilled to do so not only in worship but also in fun events like the Birthday Social on April 12th. Even though life presents uncertainty, and sometimes even fearful times, we are reminded by our Easter Scripture to find the paths we can walk with both fear and deep joy, and live in the resurrection hope.

What is Great Sabbath? Why do we gather for a Lovefeast?

The last verse we read in Matthew's gospel (which is the gospel we follow this lectionary year A) on Good Friday evening, after the death of Jesus, is this: Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were sitting there opposite the tomb (Matthew 27:61). Then we have the Sabbath day, followed by Matthew 28's account of the resurrection. This Sabbath day (Matthew 27:62-66), with only five verses, is often overlooked in many Christian traditions. But the Moravian Church has a historic connection to celebrating a Great Sabbath Lovefeast on the day between Good Friday and Easter Sunday as an important part of our Holy Week worship.

Sabbath itself is a gift of God; the day of rest and also a day of gathering together. We are encouraged to take a regular Sabbath in our week; perhaps this is a day without work (however you define this – emails, housework, etc.). But on this Great Sabbath, we are encouraged to remember the actions of Mary Magdalene and the other Mary, who

appeared to be together in this moment of deep sadness and uncertainty following the death of Jesus. We too gather as we are reminded of the importance of community, worshipping, singing and eating together in such times through the act of a lovefeast. There is no sermon in this worship service that we celebrate on Saturday, April 4th at 2 p.m.; rather the music, lovefeast and gathering is a message in itself.

Our children and youth at Central have also long practiced the tradition of also gathering earlier on Great Sabbath to decorate God's Acre with hyacinths (12 p.m. this year), preparing our space for Easter Dawn. In the midst of our fearful or distressing times, we still gather – and with hope for our tomorrows, and symbolically we place flowers on graves. The significance of these actions that have become beloved traditions are beautiful to remember in this Easter season and beyond.
