From Pastor Janel

I had the opportunity to attend the State of the City event in April where I expected to hear about all the good things happening in Bethlehem. I certainly did hear those things; especially the city's plans for renewing the 40+ public parks that are within our community. But the event did not hide the struggles of our community either; the poverty rates that have risen for seniors and the well-known skyrocketing housing and rental costs over the last 20 years. As America's 250th centered us, we were reminded both of the dream yet to be realized for some among all the good things that surround us.

As we begin the season of Eastertide and look into the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (May 24), holding the resurrection hope in the midst of a world where struggles abound can be the balance that we need. The metaphors associated with the Holy Spirit don't often bring us the God we want; wind is unpredictable, fire can be challenging, and breath can be hidden. But the Holy Spirit can bring us the God we need; a God that doesn't bend to our selfish whims, a God who sometimes challenges us to do the right thing, even if it is the difficult thing. The Holy Spirit reminds us that even in an imperfect world, God is still speaking – and breathing, challenging and living within us.

I encourage you in this Easter and season after Pentecost to live into the beautiful and challenging world that is ours. Whether it is our community of Bethlehem, our nation or our world, there are incredible peoples and acts of compassion among the devastations of power-hungry people and eruptions of violence. Holding both these realities, we are not defeated by the dark, but instead listen and look for the Spirit to move us in bringing a bit of God's presence into our world. Confirmations, ordinations, and graduations abound around us at Central. The Sunday School year comes to a close with a celebration on May 17, and as we read through our newsletter we are reminded of all the ways we celebrate the good and the new beginnings that continue to be present in the realities of struggles. A Spirit-filled blessing of Pentecost be with you!

Moravian Scholar Sharing Free Lecture As Part of the Bach Festival

The Barnette Distinguished Scholar Lecture (free) will feature Dr. Sarah Eyerly, on May 8 at 2 p.m. in Zoellner Art Center at Lehigh University. Building on her groundbreaking book *Moravian Soundscapes: A Sonic History of the Moravian Missions in Early Pennsylvania*, Dr. Eyerly explores how sound shaped colonial encounters and spiritual life in the 18th Century. Eyerly delves into the rich interplay between J.S. Bach's musical legacy and the early Moravian traditions transplanted to Pennsylvania. You'll discover how Bach's compositions resonated with Moravian communal singing practices, and her lecture highlights how Bach's influence traveled not only through text but also in the act of listening and living within complex acoustic environments.

A Presentation on Christian Nationalism

At the 2023 Synod of the Moravian Church Northern Province, the Committee on Church and Society resolved that the MCNP rejects Christian Nationalism, which supports racism and white supremacy, and fall of 2024, the Moravian Church Northern Province joined our ecumenical partners in endorsing the Statement of Christians against Christian Nationalism. What is Christian Nationalism, and in particular, how has the Moravian Church responded to the development of Christian Nationalism? What does our theology speak to this topic? Becky Lepore did extensive study on this topic during her seminary classes and created and presented a talk on Christian Nationalism in February 2025 to 120 interested congregation and community members. Becky will give an updated presentation on Sunday afternoon, May 31 at 1 p.m. in the Christian Education Building. All are welcome.

Pastor Janel Visits Gracehill Moravian Church As Part of World Heritage Travel

Pastor Janel serves on the Transnational Coordinating Group for Moravian Church Settlement World Heritage and will be representing us at an in-person meeting later this May in Gracehill, Northern Ireland. Gracehill is one of the four sites within our World Heritage designation. As a part of these meetings, she looks forward to coordinating with our other three sites (Gracehill, Herrnhut and Christiansfeld) as well as learning more about the ways that Gracehill welcomes guests to their church and historic campus.

Newest Moravian Ministry, Manna

The world is changing - social connection is declining, technology use is rising, and trust in our neighbors and institutions is at an all time low, but as dire as it seems, this is not all bad news. In fact, these changes are revealing a hunger in the hearts of folks across the Lehigh Valley for authentic community, a robust spiritual framework, and opportunities to serve. At Manna, we say, there's more than one way to be hungry, as we remember Mary's proclamation in Luke 1:53 that God "has filled the hungry with good things," and Jesus teaching "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled."

Manna Moravian Church is a new faith community putting down roots here in Bethlehem. As a part of the Moravian Church Northern Province, we are the newest emerging ministry joining the ranks of Essentials Café, YouBelong, and Tricklebee Café (among others!). Our mission is to encounter God around the table through worship, fellowship, and service, and we do this through the invitation into community groups and a worship service we call 'Dinner Church'.

While dinner church might seem strange to some, I know all you Moravians understand why this is such a valuable and important way to gather because we have the Lovefeast! A dinner church service takes place around the table, where we pray, sing, gather, share, and learn together in community all while sharing a family style meal. This unique worship space allows folks who may not be comfortable attending a traditional worship service the opportunity to join in spiritual community, many of whom are encountering the Moravian church for the first time.

At Central, all are welcomed into worship with the reminder that, *wherever you are in your journey of faith and whatever your identity may be, you are welcome at Central Moravian Church*. This message of welcome and inclusion is a beacon of light in Bethlehem and beyond as you all live into your identity as a historic congregation embracing your heritage of faith in the 21st century. It's precisely that message that we want to amplify through the work of Manna in Bethlehem. Our heritage of faith, practice of love, and commitment to hope as Moravians shapes everything we do, and we believe it's something the world could use more of.

As an emerging ministry, we need your support. Please join me in prayer for all those people who will encounter God through this work, and for the guidance of the Holy Spirit for this fledgling congregation! As we invite folks to gather around the table, just as Jesus did in his ministry, we are also looking to establish a home for Manna. We are looking to purchase a multi unit mixed commercial and residential property near downtown Bethlehem, and would appreciate any leads or information towards that end. I also would invite you to consider partnering with us in our work by making a gift towards our foundational campaign this summer. New Social Media Offering

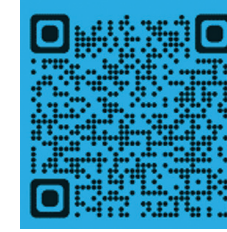

A New Gift to the Food Pantry

Everyone likes to celebrate birthdays - and we are grateful to Moravian Academy for putting together birthday kits for our food pantry clients. Each week, the food pantry offers a birthday kit (cake mix, pan, and candles, etc.) for clients with birthdays within 2 months to the day they come (for children or grandchildren). They are much appreciated – for this and continued monthly support of the food pantry with an average of 300 pounds of food, we are blessed by our Academy partners.

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle; Use Less Plastic

- Food waste is a huge problem, costly to consumers and a contributor to methane when food winds up in our landfills. But 'sell by' and 'best by' dates are confusing. Eat it? Or toss it out? Get a better understanding of food expiration dates. Here's a website to get you started: <https://www.webmd.com/diet/features/do-food-expiration-dates-matter>
 - Maybe this is the year you learn about composting! All those egg shells, vegetable peels, overripe fruit, fall leaves can be put to good use. There are lots of sites online to help you get started. You can begin with this one: <https://www.epa.gov/recycle/composting-home#:~:text=Always%20ensure%20your%20food%20scraps,and%20turn%20your%20compost%20occasionally>.
 - May is the month when many Farmers' Markets open up for the season. Shop local and support our local growers! Check out this website to find a farmers' market close to you: <https://www.buylocalglv.org/find-local-food/>
 - Have your air conditioner checked and cleaned for the summer. And seal your air ducts. Leaky air ducts can reduce a cooling system's efficiency by 30%. Sealing and insulating ducts make it easier for your AC to keep your home cool. Avoid extra air-conditioning costs by closing off rooms that are not in use.
 - Shop at the Busy Workers' Plant & Attic Treasures sale (Mothers' Day weekend). All profits from the Busy Workers' sales go to charitable causes... here in Bethlehem and all the way to Tanzania and Nepal. Plastic pots and plastic trays (for flower pots) are unwelcome at the Bethlehem Recycling Center. If you have too many, ask local garden centers and nurseries if they would like them back. Many will gladly accept them for reuse.
 - Volunteer at Monocacy Farm Project, an organic farm located on Bridle Path Road in Bethlehem. MFP supports Central's Food Pantry with fresh produce.
