## **Welcome to Central's New Pastor Rev. Becky Lepore!**

Standing ovation and applause was the reaction to Joint Board President, Jennifer Ceneviva's announcement that Becky accepted the call to serve as our new Pastor of Congregational Life. This position, previously known as the associate pastor role, was thoughtfully updated to better reflect the particular gifts, ministries, and areas of care Becky will bring to her work within our congregation as she joins Pastor Janel Rice in ministry.

Becky was ordained at Central Moravian Church on Sunday, June 14, and the livestream is available on our YouTube Channel. She will begin in July and be installed during 10 a.m. worship on Sunday, July 5. Becky's email and office will remain the same, but she will transition out of any oversight of our music ministry.

After spending many years involved in worship and music, Becky felt the stirrings of the spirit to attend seminary, and recently reflected, "Although I always loved music, the music itself was never the end goal," notes Lepore. "Instead, music was an expression of my faith and love for God and a meaningful way to help people realize their own unique gifts and strengths." We are most grateful to God's guidance in this process and God's call to Becky to serve as our Pastor of Congregational Life.

## **Pastor's Column - from Pastor Becky**

What a delight to write my first "From the Pastor" column, and what a perfect opportunity to say thank you! Since that first Sunday in September 2002, when I began my role as the Director of Music and Organist, you nurtured, mentored, taught, guided, inspired, and encouraged me in both music and in my relationship with God. Along the way, you decided that the name Minister of Music more aptly described my role, and I was humbled.

From the time that I began discerning my call to ordained ministry and throughout my entire seminary education, you supported me again and again. Between my graduation from Seminary and my ordination, your emails, cards, texts, phone calls, your presence, and most especially, your prayers and your expressions of love and care have been overwhelming, and I am filled with gratitude.

What a privilege and honor to be called to be your Pastor of Congregational Life. Because the call process is one that requires confidentiality, it was excruciating not being able to talk about this new role and share my joy! So, please forgive me when I could not be truthful or transparent about what was next after graduation.

I am both overjoyed and humbled to be called as your Pastor of Congregational Life. What is a Pastor of Congregational Life? It is exactly as it sounds. Whereas Pastor Janel, as Senior Pastor, will have responsibilities as being Head of Staff and supporting areas of ministry pertaining to all things Personnel, Finance, Property, Governance, Communication, History, World Heritage and Tours, Emergency Preparedness, and Community Relations, I will support the ministries of the congregation: Christian Education and Spiritual Formation (growing in faith), Social Action including Mental Health, Food Pantry, Cynthia's Boutique, Racial Justice and Care for Creation (serving in faith), assimilation of new members and small group ministry (finding belonging in faith), and IT and Digital Ministry (connecting in faith). Pastor Janel and I will share responsibilities in pastoral care and worship. I will keep the same office and email address, while Janel will be moving to the first-floor office over the summer.

(The new Director of Music, once hired, will take the second-floor office where Janel has been.) My office hours will be Monday through Wednesday mornings and Friday mornings. Meetings, appointments, and visiting will take place in the afternoons, and committee meetings in the evenings. Thursdays will be my day off.

This past week, as we prayed the Easter Liturgy for Mary Ann Giles' memorial service, I was struck by these words, **"Make us complete in everything good so that we may do your will, working among us all that is pleasing in your sight; through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever and ever. Amen."** Through Christ, may we continue to work together, worship, study, fellowship, sing, and pray together, serve each other, and be the Body of Christ to one another as we share the light of Christ to the world around us.

### Celebrations Galore! July 12<sup>th</sup>: Old Chapel's 275<sup>th</sup> and America 250!

Celebrate the Old Chapel's 275<sup>th</sup> anniversary (July 10, 1751) on Sunday, July 12<sup>th</sup> with a Lovefeast during our 10 a.m. Service in the Sanctuary. As we have spent this year celebrating the Chapel (especially during our wonderful Lenten program), this will be the culmination of events remembering the legacy and celebrating our current ministries in this beautiful space. Following worship, the Bethlehem Area Trombone Choir, the oldest continuously performing brass ensemble in America, will play on the Church Green at 11 a.m. and all are welcome for light refreshments following.

Then stay in Bethlehem as Central joins our World Heritage partners and our greater historic district between Main and Broad for a block party celebrating American 250!

On July 12<sup>th</sup>, from 12 – 5 p.m., the lower church green of Central Moravian Church, located near the end of Main Street, will be one of the sites taking part in the America 250 celebration. With gratitude for support from the Bethlehem Area Moravian Ministries committees, our seven Moravian churches will come together to showcase several of the church bands as well as the headliner, The Stank Factory at 3 p.m. The Stank Factory is a five piece band inspired by the jazz, funk, soul, and blues sounds of New Orleans led by Moravian University graduate and friend of Central, Patrick Kerssen. We will also share free cotton candy, water and information about our churches at a table on Main Street.

The Old Chapel and Sanctuary will be available for tours during this time, and there will be lots of other vendors, children's activities and promotions throughout the day as we celebrate both our World Heritage inscription and America 250 celebrations.

So what comes next? In the interim, Luke DiGiacinto has graciously agreed to serve as interim organist beginning in July through October, and Allen Frank will assist with directing the choir. Luke will play for the one summer service through September 6<sup>th</sup>, and then when we return to our regular worship schedule, Richard will play for the 9 a.m. and Luke will play for the 11 a.m. services. We are so grateful for Richard for playing and directing the Chapel Choir throughout next year.

As we transition to a new Director of Music, this person will take over playing and directing the choirs at both the 9 and 11 a.m. services in fall 2027. We are most grateful to the leadership of Richard Miller in building our Chapel choir and look forward to its flourishing under our new music director's leadership as well.

### Caring for Our Neighbors: Bethlehem Emergency Shelter

The BES treats everyone who walks through their doors with compassion and respect. The ongoing support of Central Moravian Church contributes to making the BES mission possible.

During the 2025–2026 shelter season, as many as 70 men and women came to the shelter for a safe place to sleep, a hot meal, and a warm shower. Once the season ended, the shelter continues its work by distributing bagged lunches and working alongside the Bethlehem Area Public Library to offer a Resource Navigator to help our unhoused neighbors cut through complex systems and connect with the support they deserve.

#### Bed Count Totals:

- 7,282 bed nights provided to men
- 4,213 bed nights provided to women

#### Bed Count Breakdowns:

- 1,000 bed nights provided to veterans
- 2,102 bed nights provided to individuals who were employed, but unable to find housing
- 4,861 bed nights provided to individuals who self-reported mental health diagnosis

Recently, State Representative Steve Samuelson was able to secure a \$313,608 grant toward BES's long-term project to convert the shelter to year-round use. ### Welcome to a New Staff Position: Tours and Communications Coordinator

Since Central joined Moravian University, Bethlehem Area Moravians, City of Bethlehem, Historic Bethlehem Museums & Sites, and Northampton County to accept the honor of a UNESCO World Heritage, we have been discussing how to best share our history, buildings and living ongoing heritage and ministries today. As a way to expand and assist with the ongoing Friday and Saturday open houses, and bring about a more consistent tour as well as outreach to our local community and businesses, the greater Moravian church world, and others, our Joint Board has approved the creation of a new part-time position; Tours and Communications Coordinator.

The job is described as follows; Following with the Moravian heritage and tradition of a "Fremdendiener" ("Guests' Servant"), this position will serve to welcome guests to experience the living and historic values of Moravians and the enduring intrinsic value of this World Heritage Settlement. This position will also assist with communication needs, including social media, print and other opportunities for engagement and education. We are thrilled that this position will help coordinate our many wonderful volunteers, allow us to expand our tour offerings and continue to tell both our historic and living Moravian story to the greater community. We know that this is a special outreach opportunity as we welcome in people to hear about a living faith and history built around community, equality and love and send them back into their own communities to tell this story in their own ways.
