The 2026 Synod

The 2026 Synod of the Moravian Church in America, Northern Province was held June 24-26 in Minneapolis, Minnesota. With the theme, “God’s Vision, Our Mission, Your Decision,” two hundred voting delegates were divided into nine committees and were presented with fifty-eight memorials and reports. Highlights included:

- **The Rev. Brian Dixon** and **The Rev. Nasel Ephraim** were elected as bishops of the Moravian Unity. Rev. Dixon currently serves as pastor of Emmaus Moravian Church in Emmaus, PA. He was ordained a deacon in the Moravian Church in 2005 and consecrated a presbyter of the church in 2009. Prior to serving at Emmaus, Brian served in North Dakota and Minnesota. Rev. Ephraim currently serves as pastor of Redeemer Moravian Church in Philadelphia, PA and as Chair of the Northern Province Provincial Women’s Board. She was ordained in 2002, consecrated a presbyter in 2009 and has served in Barbados and St. Kitts.

The Moravian Church in America (Northern Province) is planning to hold a special Joint District and Provincial Synod in 2028. This gathering will unify the Canadian, Western, and Eastern districts alongside the provincial synod into a single event, with plans to rotate the location among the districts every four years.

- **The Rev. David Bennett** was re-elected as president of the Provincial Elders’ Conference. Dave has served as PEC president since 2023 and will continue this role through 2028. Because of the Northern Province’s plan to hold a special joint district and provincial synod in 2028, the term for this PEC will be for two years. Following the 2028 Synod, PEC terms will return to four-year terms. (The PEC is the Province’s highest governing board, providing administrative leadership to congregations and program agencies. It is made up of four lay members, plus the presidents of each of the province’s three districts (Eastern, Western and Canadian) and the president of the PEC.)
- **Blondel Jones-Grant** (United Moravian Church, NYC), **Ralph Wanamaker, Jr.** (West Side Moravian Church, Bethlehem, PA), **Keith Gohdes** (Canaan Moravian Church, Davenport, ND), and **Tammy Lavoy** (Newfoundland Moravian Church, Newfoundland, PA) are the newly elected PECNP lay members.
- **The Rev. Dr. Melissa Johnson**, Eastern District president; **The Rev. Jason Andersen**, Western District president; and **David Jones**, president of the Board of Elders of the Canadian District who will continue to serve on the PEC.

This synod was the first paperless Synod of the Moravian Church Northern Province! Synod utilized a Dropbox-based online document management system for all documents for committee work, memorials presented to the committees, and for legislation that came before the synod during plenary sessions.

Central Moravian Church’s delegates included the Rev. Janel Rice, Jennifer Ceneviva, Brenda Hoelman, Mike Kane, and Katie Owens. Dr. Christian Rice, Rev. Grace Hochella, and Rev. Becky Lepore attended as did Hank Naisby as a part of the District Board, and Rev. Dr. Betsy Miller, Jeff Long and Paul Peucker in leadership positions. Special thanks to alternates Martha and Mark Jones, JoEllen LaPrade, and Bob Wascura who were willing to be on standby!

Cybersecurity Workshop - August 16

Cybersecurity is how to protect computer networks and systems from service disruption and information theft. The goal is to defend and protect servers, personal and private data, computers, and mobile devices (smartphones, laptops and tablets) from attack resulting in damage or theft. Cyber threats are evolving at a very rapid rate.

In 2024, there were 3,205 data breaches reported, effecting 353 million victims. Major companies lost billions of customer records. Because cybersecurity is essential and cannot be ignored, the Digital Ministry Committee is dedicated to keeping our congregation safe by providing information regarding the ever-changing world of technology. Paul de Vries and Will Schwab will conduct a 60-minute Cybersecurity workshop on Sunday, August 16th in the Christian Education building, lower level, (40 W. Church Street) after the 10 a.m. worship service. All are welcome.

Join Us for Candle-Making in September

It is time to prepare for the 2026 Christmas Holiday Season with the making of Beeswax Candles. Production starts on Tuesday, September 8 and repeats on Tuesday the 15th and the 22nd. A 9 a.m. start with a break for coffee and donuts around 10:30 a.m. has been the norm. We are usually cleaned up and ready to go home around noon.

For those that may be interested in helping, two stations are traditionally established. There is wick preparation in one room and mold stringing (12 candles to a mold) in the "hot shop" where wax is also poured. The molds cool rather quickly, allowing the candles to be removed, hung to dry, and the molds reused several times throughout the morning. We will produce between 8 and 10 thousand candles that will be used for our Christmas Eve Service and seasonal activities of other churches, universities and civic groups.

The rooms used for candle making are in the basement of the Central Moravian Church main office at 73 W. Church Street. Parking is available in the parking lot at the rear of the building.

Reflections on Coming to the End...
Richard Miller’s Final Year

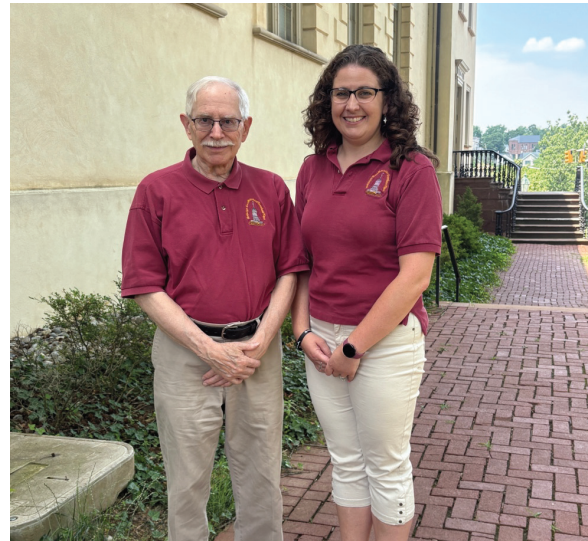
Bethlehem Area Moravian Trombone Choir's Change of Leadership

As of August 1st, there will be a change of leadership for the Bethlehem Area Moravian (BAM) Trombone Choir. Donald Kemmerer, who has led the group for over 40 years, has retired, and Caitlin Heckman has been named the new director.

Don Kemmerer was born and raised in Bethlehem. After graduating from Liberty High School, he completed his musical education at West Chester University, majoring in trumpet and French horn. After college, Don taught instrumental music in public schools, eventually becoming a fulltime professional musician. Don has performed with many of the bands in the Lehigh Valley Area and is often featured as a guest soloist. He has been a member of the Bethlehem Municipal Band for over 40 years and was its director from 1989 until 2025. Don has also been active in the Moravian Music Foundation, including serving as a clinician and Trombone Choir Director for multiple Moravian Music Festivals and Moravian Music Weekends.

Caitlin Heckman is a graduate of Moravian College (now University) and has been in the music education field for 15 years. She currently teaches elementary band and orchestra in the Easton Area School District while also playing principal trombone with The Allentown Band, America's oldest civilian band. A lifelong member of Central Moravian Church, Caitlin began playing with the BAM Trombone Choir in 2006. She is also the director of the Central Church brass ensemble, has sung in the Central Choir, participated in several Moravian Music Festivals, and previously served on the board of trustees for the Moravian Music Foundation.

The BAM Trombone Choir is the oldest continuously operating musical organization in the United States, tracing its origins back to 1754. The Trombone Choir began as a functional ensemble, announcing births, deaths, festivals,

and worship services, and continues to play for church services, funerals, and community events. The group performs with a full consort of soprano, alto, tenor, bass, and contrabass trombones, preserving the unique history of the ensemble.

Central Moravian Church is blessed to have the BAM Trombone Choir play for our worship services at least ten times every year, including for some of our Holy Week services, the Easter Dawn service, the outdoor August 13th lovefeast, the Christmas Eve Children's Lovefeast, and our New Year's Eve Watchnight Service. Thank you, Don, for your many decades of musical leadership. Welcome, Caitlin, as you continue the legacy of the BAM Trombone Choir. We are blessed.

Exhibition Honoring Jeanette Barres Zug

The Moravian Museum of Bethlehem is proud to present an exhibition honoring Jeanette Barres Zug, whose leadership, vision, and dedication were instrumental in the founding and early development of the museum. An active member of Central Moravian Church, Jeanette devoted decades of her life to preserving Moravian history and culture, helping to shape one of Bethlehem's most important cultural institutions. Before there were professional staff, formal docent programs, or a Moravian Museum housed in the Gemeinhaus, there was Jeanette Barres Zug. This exhibition traces the life of the volunteer whose work helped define how generations of visitors first encountered Moravian Bethlehem. Baptized in 1907 by her uncle, a Moravian pastor in Lancaster County, Jeanette grew up in Bethlehem and attended Moravian Seminary for Girls. Her fluency in German and French was so strong that teachers frequently called upon her to interpret for visiting dignitaries. She continued her education at Wellesley College, spent a formative summer studying in Munich, and later returned home to teach languages at Moravian Preparatory School. In 1929, she married Charles Zug Jr. at Central Moravian Church, deepening her lifelong connection to the Moravian community.

Jeanette's work with the museum began in the 1930s when fellow Central Moravian Church member Miriam Taylor asked her to organize tour guides for a Rotary Club convention. What was intended as a one-time favor became a lifelong vocation. Jeanette trained generations of guides, served twelve years as President of the Board, helped lead the museum's 1966 move from the Sisters' House to the Gemeinhaus, organized the 1752 Apothecary, and contributed chapters to Bethlehem, the First Hundred Years.

Through photographs, archival materials, family loans, and personal effects, the exhibition explores Jeanette Zug's remarkable life and lasting contributions to the museum and the broader Moravian community. It also reflects on the dedication of the volunteers whose efforts preserved Bethlehem's unique heritage and established a foundation for future generations. *(Exhibition on view at the Moravian Museum from June 25, 2026, through January 31, 2027).*
